

It is with great rejoicing that the Seattle Girls' Choir, will be embarking on a Concert Tour to Austria, Germany and Italy, June 27 - July 13, 2000.

The Seattle Girls' Choir, under the direction of Dr. Jerome Wright, will present sacred Liturgies and formal concerts in some of the most beautiful churches in the world, St. The choir will also partake in the Salzburg Music Festival. On June 29th, the Choir will sing for the evening Mass at St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna, and sing for the Sunday Mass at the Cathedral in Siena.

While in Rome, the Choir has accepted an invitation to be the principal Choir singing at the 5:00PM Solemn Mass at the Altar of the Chair in Saint Peter's Basilica on Tuesday, July 11, 2000. We embrace the opportunity of serving in this role of musical leadership at the Vatican with a sense of honor, humility and great gladness.

On July 12, Wednesday evening at 9:00pm., the choir will also present a liturgical concert at St. Ignatius Church in Rome. This performance is one in a series of professionally organized concerts, enjoyed by an audience of over one thousand.

This journey will take us to the sacred sites of our Christian faith, including the Sistine Chapel, the basilicas of Christian Rome, and the Catacombs. We will also take in the historic venues of ancient Rome, including the Coliseum and the Roman Forum. Visiting Vienna, Salzburg, Munich, Venice, Florence and Siena will certainly round out what promises to be a spiritually rewarding and altogether unforgettable experience.

We look forward to traveling with you in 2000.

-ITINERARY-

♦ Day 1. June 27. Tuesday: Depart USA

This afternoon depart Seattle International Airport via British Airways for your overseas pilgrimage to Vienna, Austria via London. Complimentary meals and beverages will be served aloft.

◆ Day 2, June 28, Wednesday: Arrive Vienna

Upon your arrival at Vienna Airport, Peter's Way Tour Director will meet you and assist you. Your luggage will be transferred to a comfortable touring bus (Porterage is included at each hotel upon arrival and departure throughout your tour) and soon you will be on your way to your hotel in Vienna, the Music Capital of the World!! The City of Mozart, Beethoven, Brahms, Strauss, etc., etc.! Check-in at hotel. Dinner and overnight in Vienna.

Day 3, June 29, Thursday: AM/Tour of Vienna's Highlights -Evening/Mass at St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna

After breakfast, begin our day with a tour of the most important historical sights of Vienna - see the chapel of the Hofburg Palace, winter residence of the Habsburg emperors; tour St. Stephen's Cathedral; the Capuchin Church containing the imperial vaults; St. Charles' Church, a splendid example of late Baroque architecture; and pass by the Belvedere Palace, former residence of Prince Eugene of Savoy. Drive around the Ring, one of the most magnificent boulevards in the world, passing the Vienna Opera; Museums; House of Parliament; City Hall; and the Burgtheater. Lunch on your own. Next, enjoy an extended highlight tour of Schonbrunn Palace

and gardens, the summer residence of the Habsburgs. Balance of the day at leisure, This evening, you will be transferred to St. Stephen's Cathedral to sing for the (Feast Mass of Ss. Peter & Paul) by the Seattle Girls' Choir.

Dinner and overnight in Vienna.

◆ Day 4, June 30, Friday: Tales of the Vienna Woods-Evening/Concert in Vienna Woods

Leisurely breakfast at your hotel. Balance of the morning at leisure. Perhaps you would like to walk to view Mozart's memorial; or walk along Kaerntner strasse, a pedestrian area where glamorous stores line the sidewalks; take a ride in a horse-drawn coach; wander along the winding streets of the old city with architecture reminiscent of past centuries. Lunch on your own.

This afternoon, leave on our excursion to the enchanting and peaceful Vienna Woods via Hinterbruhl, a summer resort and residential area. Stop at the ancient Cistercian Abbey of Heiligenkreuz, founded in 1335 by Leopold the Holy. The Romanesque basilica has a contrasting Gothic-style choir and an interesting Chapter House which was once the living quarters of the Order. On to Mayerling, the romantic hunting lodge where the heir to the throne, Archduke Rudolf and Baroness Marie Vetsera carried out their suicide pact. Next, we visit Baden, famous even in Roman times for the sulphur springs and thermal baths. Then, we continue to Langenlois. The community of Langenlois will host the Seattle Girls' Choir and Perform a Concert for the town. Dinner and overnight in Vienna.

Day 5, July 1, Saturday: Melk Abbey - Sound of Music Tour - Salzburg -Evening Opening of the Salzburg Music Festival

After breakfast, we leave Vienna and drive to the beautiful Wachau, a region which is the pride of the historic preservation movement in Austria. We arrive at Melk, with its Abbey crowning the rocky hill overlooking the Danube. It is the best sample of Baroque architecture in Austria. Visit the Benedictine Abbey which was founded in 1702. Its Library contains over 80,000 books and 2,000 manuscripts - all on religious subjects. Lunch on your own.

Then, drive along the landscapes of the Salzkammergut to Mondsee to reflect at this delightful resort, where in the movie Sound of Music, Maria and the Baron were married. Then continue to St. Gilgen on Lake Wolfgang, which offers one of the best known resort and where the Mozart fountain recalls the family connection of Mozart with this favored land. We continue to Fuschl, pictured in the beginning of "The Sound of Music". Continue to the Baroque city of Salzburg, a jewel set on the beautiful banks of the Salzach River.

Late afternoon: 6:00pm. Opening of the Salzburg Music Festival held at the Stieglkeller including a special dinner. Each participating Choir (Seattle Girls' Choir) will sing two pieces of repertory of their own choosing. After the performance all Choirs will sing together the "Ave Maria", by the Hungarian composer György Orbán. 8:00pm. Dinner at the Stieglkeller enjoying cultural exchange with the other guest choirs and individual performing. Overnight in Salzburg.

Day 6, July 2, Sunday: AM/Sing for Mass at one of the famous Churches in Salzburg PM/Tour of Salzburg's Highlights

After breakfast at your hotel, depart for a local church assigned by the Salzburg Music Festival Committee, where the Seattle Girls' Choir will present the music for the Sunday service. Time to meet the congregation following the service.

This afternoon, we visit the hamlet of Oberndorf and the chapel where "Silent Night, Holy Night" was composed in 1818. Then, our guide will be ready to take us on a guided tour of Salzburg's sights along Getreidegasse, the city's pedestrian street, lined with authentic 17th and 18th century buildings including the house where Mozart was born. View Monchsberg with the fortress "Hohensalzburg" which overlooks the city and built into the side of Monchsberg is the Salzburg Festspielhaus, home of the famous Salzburg Festival Operas; Residenzplatz, the center square of Salzburg, is dominated by the dynamic sculpture of the Residenzbrunnen, the largest baroque fountain, and nearby stands the Cathedral dating from 1614. Visit St. Peter's Abbeynext to the cemetery where the escape was filmed in "Sound of Music" and where most of Mozart's religious works were premiered.

Day 7, July 3, Monday: King Ludwig Royal Castle - Munich

After breakfast, we leave Salzburg to explore King Ludwig's majestic castles - the Cinderella-style Neuschwanstein, plus the King's former residence, Hohenschwangau. Go back to the times of Wagner as you visit the royal apartments decorated with scenes from German sagas and Wagner's operas. See the throne rooms and music halls. Lunch enroute on your own.

Then, we continue to Munich (city of the monks). This is the capital of Bavaria and

the second largest city in Germany. Check-in at hotel in Munich.

Dinner and overnight in Munich.

Day 8, July 4, Tuesday: AM/Tour of Munich's Hightlights - PM/Performace

After breakfast, our guide will take us for an orientation tour of Munich. Visit the Nymphenburg Palace, summer home of the Bavarian monarchs with its magnificent gardens, and the Olympic Park, site of the 1972 Olympics. We will also see the historic glockenspiel on the Marienplatz, and the revered twin-towered Frauenkirche (Church of Our Lady), the most familiar landmark of old Munich.

This evening, formal concert at the Burgersaalkirche for the city of Munich by the Seattle Girls' Choir. Dinner and overnight in Munich.

Day 9, July 5, Wednesday: Munich - Dolomites - Venice

After continental breakfast, leave Munich and drive South through the Alpine peaks and chalets. Forming a Heidi picture-book, with impressive views as you cross Europe's highest Europa Bridge. Cross the famous Brenner pass into the unforgettable scenery of the Italian Dolomites, Alpine paradise of the Dolomites, a year-round mountain playground of unspoiled villages and unsurpassed scenery. Lunch on your own enroute.

Then, we continue to the lovely and famous Lagoon-City on the Adriatic Coast is like a giant maze with its tiny alleys and hidden piazzas linked by narrow footbridges over the many large and small canals.

Dinner and overnight in Mestre suburb of Venice.

◆ Day 10, July 6, Thursday: AM/Half day tour of Venice - Evening/Formal Concert

Continental breakfast at your hotel. We then start our walking tour at Venice's hub of activity, Piazza San Marco, which is lined with galleries, luxury shops and charming cafes. As you will see, dominating the Square is the magnificent Basilica San Marco where the mixture of styles - Byzantine, Romanesque and Gothic - and profuse decoration reflect Venice's history. Marvel at the shimmering mosaics encrusted on its interior walls, the precious sculptures and rare marbles. Admire the Camanile, having simple lines contrasting sharply with the sumptuous decor of the Church and Clock Tower where famous Moors have been striking the hours for over 500 years. Continue to the Bridge of Sighs which connects to the Doges' Palace and the Piombi Prisons. The bridge is so named because of the sad laments of the prisoners as they were led across it to certain torture and possible death.

Lunch on your own and afternoon at leisure. Don't miss out on the optional gondola

trip, gliding along the picturesque canals with a local troubadour to serenade you. This evening concert at Santi Giovanni e Paolo or at Santa Maria Gloriosa dei Frari by the Seattle Girls' Choir.

Dinner and overnight in Mestre suburb of Venice.

◆ Day 11, July 7, Friday: Ravenna - Florence

After a continental breakfast, we leave Mestre and drive to the lovely town of Ravenna, the city of Mosaics, Ravenna. Visit the wonderful Byzantine mosaics in the 6th-century Church of San Vitale and in the Basilica of Sant' Apollinare at Classe. These two things alone would warrant a long, long journey. Stop for lunch enroute. Then, we continue to through the Tuscan hills that have for centuries inspired saints, artists and admirers of beauty to the Renaissance city of Florence. Dinner and overnight in Florence or Vaglia, suburb of Florence.

◆ Day 12, July 8, Saturday: AM/Highlights Tour of Florence -**Evening/Concert in Florence**

After a continental breakfast, our local guide will be ready to take you the Accademia which holds the superb "David" by Michelangelo; then, you will be ransferred to the beautiful Piazza Del Duomo and the delicately patterned green, white and pink Cathedral of Santa Maria Del Fiore, crowned with its magnificent Dome by Brunelleschi; Giotto's Bell Tower; the Romanesque Baptistry of St. John, with the exquisite bronze doors by Ghiberti which Michelangelo called the Gates of Paradise. Then, continue to visit the 13th century Franciscan Church of the Holy Cross which holds the Tombs of the greatest of Florentine men. Lunch on your own. This afternoon is free to do as you wish - shopping, sightseeing, whatever. Perhaps you would like to visit the Piazza Della Signoria; the famous shop-lined bridge, Ponte Vecchio; and the adjacent "Straw Market"; or shop for leather, gold or other Florentine souvenirs

This evening, you will be transferred to Santa Maria Del Ricci for a formal concert for the City of Florence by the Seattle Girls' Choir.

Dinner and overnight in Florence or Vaglia, suburb of Florence

Day 13, July 9, Sunday: Sights of Siena - Rome

After a continental breakfast, leave Florence aboard our comfortable motorcoach to the nearby Gothic city of Siena. Enjoy a city tour, where we will begin with an introduction of the beautiful Duomo, which reveals so much of the city's history and aspirations. Time will be given to visit the Baptistery, located behind the Cathedral. It is fronted by an unfinished Gothic facade and houses a Renaissance font with panels illustrating the Baptist's life. The Seattle Girls Choir is invited to sing for the Sunday Mass at the Cathedral of Siena. Lunch on your own.

Continue your tour of Siena, a city that is self-contained and still rural in parts behind its medieval walls. Siena was a major city in Europe throughout the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. It is a Gothic city that today can be enjoyed by just walking around. In the center of Siena is the great square, Il Campo, built at the convergence of the city's principal roads, the Banchi di Sopra, Banchi di Sotto, and Via di Citá. This afternoon, continue to Rome "Eternal City". History evolving over 2,500 years will be made visible for you by the Roman ruins, 15th-century churches, 17th-century palaces and 20th-century monuments. On to your hotel. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Day 14, July 10, Monday: Full day tour of Christian and Ancient Rome

Continental breakfast at your hotel. We begin our day with a visit to the elegant Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, the second largest church in Rome. Its origins go back to the time of Constantine, and it is erected over the tomb of St. Paul. It was burnt in 1823 and subsequently rebuilt in virtually the same size and plan. Surrounding the nave are mosaic medallions of the popes, from Peter to John Paul II. Then, we continue our tour with a visit to the Basilica of St. John Lateran, the cathedral and See of the Archdiocese of Rome. Like St. Peter's and St. Paul's, this basilica was one of Constantine's creations. From the fourth through the early fourteenth century, it was the home and residence of all the popes. Then, we visit St. Mary Major, one of the four major basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III in the fifth century. It is especially noted for the Roman mosaics in its nave, depicting scenes from the Old Testament. Stop for lunch on your own.

This afternoon your sightseeing will continue with a visit to the ancient Roman Forum. Then, see the Arch of Titus and the Arch of Constantine and proceed to the Coliseum for a fascinating explanation of its history. Continue on to the grandiose white marble monument of King Victor Emmanuel II, often called the "Wedding Cake." See the Trajan Column and the Market (the ancient Roman equivalent of a department store). Continue to visit the Church of St. Peter in Chains to see the original chains in which St. Peter was brought captive to Rome and the statue of Moses, one of Michelangelo's greatest masterpieces. End our day with a visit to the Trevi Fountain to toss in a coin to insure your "Arrivederci Roma.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

◆ Day 15, July 11, Tuesday: AM/Pantheon - Vatican Museum; Sistine Chapel -PM/Tour of St. Peter's and sing for the 5:00pm Mass.

After continental breakfat, a visit will be made to the Pantheon, a temple built between 118 and 125AD by Hadrian over a former temple site of 27BC. The "eye of God", a 30-foot opening in the roof, is the only light source in this structure housing the tomb of artist Raphael. Then, you will have a private visit of the Vatican Museums. Walk in the footsteps of the Princes of the Church through the richly decorated palaces and galleries. Visit the Pinoteca (Picture Gallery), which houses religious works by Giotto, Raphael, da Vinci, Fra Angelico, and Caravaggio, among others. Continue to the Sistine Chapel, the private chapel of the popes, where Michelangelo painted his monumental frescoes. Lunch on your own.

This afternoon, we visit the St. Peter's Basilica to see Michelangelo's magnificent Pieta and to take in the awesome architecture and the statuary adorning this largest of all Christian churches. Then, walk to the Altar of the Chair at St. Peter's Basilica for the 5:00pm. Mass at which the Seattle Girls' Choir will be invited to sing for the Mass. Your farewell dinner to Rome this evening will be at La Vigna dei Papi Osteria in Rome. Experience an atmosphere of hospitality and friendship, and taste the Mediterranean cuisine in a typical Roman atmosphere with wine and music.

Dinner and overnight in Rome.

◆ Day 16, July 12, Wednesday: AM/Papal Audience - PM/At Leisure -Evening formal concert for the city of Rome

After continental breakfast, you will be transported into the heart of Christendom for an audience with Pope John Paul II. The Seattle Girls' Choir will sing a selection for him when announced during the English language portion. This will be an experience that you will never forget! Lunch on your own.

This afternoon is your opportunity to explore the sights, sounds and tastes of Rome all on your own! Perhaps you may want to treat yourself to a leisurely multi-course lunch in a quaint trattoria. There are always plenty of churches, museums, piazzas and ancient ruins to explore. This is the time to hit Gucci's and other high fashion spots, as well as the local shops and street vendors. Rome is yours!

After early dinner, this evening you will be transferred to St. Ignatius Church for a formal public concert for the city of Rome by the Seattle Girls' Choir.

Overnight in Rome.

◆ Day 17, July 13, Thursday: Return to the USA.

Continental breakfast at your hotel. Then you will be transferred to Rome's Leonardo Da Vinci Airport for your return flight to the U.S.A.

Unexpected circumstances might require alteration of details described in this brochure.

Terms and Conditions

- ◆ PAYMENT: Payment must be made by check. In an effort to keep our prices as low as possible and to avoid charges that add cost to our products, we do not accept credit cards.
- ◆ AIR TRANSPORTATION: Roundtrip from Seattle International Airport via British Airways. Airfare is subject to increases prior to date of travel. By sending your deposit together with your completed reservation form, airfare will be guaranteed against future fare increases.
- ◆ ACCOMMODATIONS: Price per person is based on two persons sharing a twin or triple bedded rooms with private facilities in tourist and first class hotels throughout your tour. Single Rooms are limited but may be requested at time of booking for an additional charge of \$650.00. While single rooms provide privacy, they are often smaller than twin rooms and sometimes poorly located.
- ◆ SINGLE TRAVELERS: We honestly do not like to assess an additional charge for the single traveler and will make every effort (if you so desire) to match you with a same-gender roommate when we receive your application. If there is no one with whom you can share accommodations, you will be charged the single room supplement fee.
- MEALS: Continental breakfast and dinner daily as per itinerary. Beverages (coffee, tea, mineral water) are not included at dinner.
- ◆ TRANSFER AND PORTERAGE: Roundtrip private transfers from/to Hotel/Airport. Porterage of one piece of luggage throughout your tour at airports and hotels. Although the Airlines will allow you to check two pieces of luggage, we strongly suggest that you travel with one suitcase and one carry-on.

- ◆ CANCELLATIONS: From the time your deposit is received up to 90 days prior to departure there will be a \$100 cancellation fee per person to cover administrative services. From 89 to 61 days prior to departure, the cancellation fee will be \$250 per person. - ◆ IMPORTANT: All participants must have a valid passport. Those participants holding passports from foreign countries must notify our office for additional requirements. At this time no vaccinations or visas are required for US Citizens.

Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave \$1.00 per person for the waiters after each meal; \$1.00 per person per day for the Maid/Bell Boys. Tips for the bus driver and escort/tour manager are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. Other gratuities are usually handled individually.
